## Talking Burleson #1

Well I have been doing this for over 20 years, and I don't know how many times people (my wife for one) asked what we are doing? Well we started back in 1995 with our first meeting in the basement of the Stanly County Library, and we would hear the Library will "close in 5 minutes" well then we would go out the sidewalk and continue our discussions. This continued for several years and Hilda Snuggs volunteer the use of Miss Lena Burleson's Farm House and we have been there ever since.

Yesterday we had a very special meeting, Cass Gannaway, came from Tennessee, she is a descendant of William and Jane Burleson Castle, who moved to Miss in 1834. Jane Burleson is the daughter of Isaac Burleson Sr. and William Castle is descendant Thomas Cassel a American Rev War Patriot we will be honoring by placing his Marker in the Castle Meeting House Cemetery.

We then went to the Springer Cemetery where Isaac Burleson Sr. in buried and where we placed a marker for him back on May 28, 1994. That was a long walk in the cemetery. Then we went to the Burleson #1 and #2 Cemetery and John Hoyle Burleson, point out some of the early home places for our Burleson Ancestors, where each one had received land grants for.
